DESIGN TRUST and Storefront for Art and Architecture present: STOREFRONT INTERNATIONAL SERIES: HONG KONG

(Hong Kong, 19 June 2017) DESIGN TRUST, an initiative of the Hong Kong Ambassadors of Design, is pleased to announce its first collaboration with the New York-based **Storefront for Art and Architecture** – the influential non-profit organisation committed to the advancement of innovative positions in architecture, art and design – on its first ever appearance in Hong Kong.

Formatted as a three-day series of events, **Storefront International Series: Hong Kong (Storefront IS Hong Kong)** will showcase a series of events that will take place in contested sites across Hong Kong between **7**th - **9**th **July**. These events seek to address the nature of urban public life, and to highlight the challenges and opportunities faced by Hong Kong residents.

Local and global agents from various fields will present and discuss their ideas and observations about various places within the city, bringing to the forefront a larger conversation about the cultural and physical landscapes of the region.

As part of the Storefront International Series: Hong Kong, a public ideas review for Design Trust Futures Studio, DESIGN TRUST's new flagship programme conceptualized by Co-founder and Executive Director Marisa Yiu, will also be held on 8th July.

"We are thrilled to partner with Storefront for Art and Architecture, bringing their energy, spirit and criticality to our city. I'm sure this is just the beginning of more conversations, which challenge our perception and understanding of public life. I am also excited to see how Storefront International Series Hong Kong will inflect upon our new flagship programme, which brings local community members in dialogue with global experts to tackle issues of "smallness" and compact living," says Marisa Yiu, Co-founder, Executive Director, DESIGN TRUST.

Storefront IS Hong Kong is part of the Storefront International Series, a nomadic project that brings the experimental formats of Storefront's events series to cities and territories around the globe. Establishing a transversal format of inquiry, Storefront International Series works with local individuals and institutions to identify and address the most pressing issues in a particular region through alternative frameworks of discussion. By bringing together agents from the fields of art, architecture, literature, politics, real estate, anthropology, economics, technology, design, and science with members of the public, the Storefront International Series aims to articulate local desires within a global context.
